## About Juvenile Justice Intermediate Evaluation

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Wheeler Clinic's Juvenile Justice Intermediate Evaluation program provides an integrated, comprehensive multidisciplinary strength-based evaluation of court-referred youth, ages 10 through 18, with complex behavioral health needs.

## The evaluation includes:

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- Cognitive and personality assessment
- Psychiatric evaluation
- Educational testing
- Substance abuse and trauma screening
- Home-based family assessment

Individualized recommendations for placement, education, treatment and other service needs are developed in partnership with the family and other critical stakeholders with a focus on building on identified strengths and resources.

We work with youth served by the New Britain, Middletown and New Haven juvenile court systems.



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Licensed or approved by the Connecticut Department of Children and Families, the Connecticut Department of Public Health and the Connecticut State Department of Education, accredited by The Joint Commission.

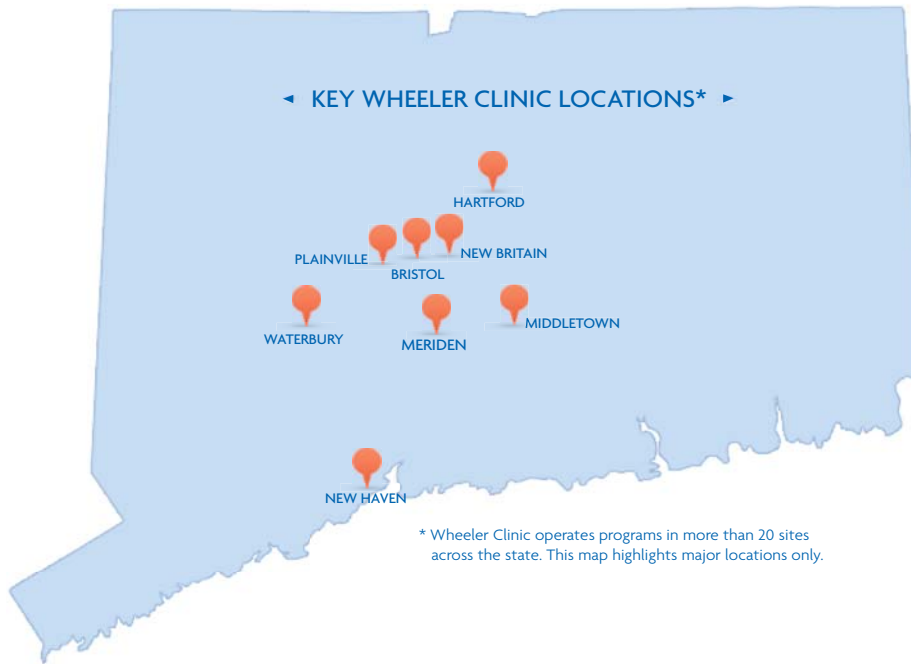
