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#### WOODLAND STREET RENOVATIONS NEAR COMPLETION

An extensive renovation project at Wheeler's Hartford flagship location at the 43-49 Woodland Street campus is almost finished, promising an even more welcoming environment for individuals and families. Wheeler's Alternative in the Community (AIC) Job Development Specialists assist clients in overcoming the impact of their criminal record on gaining meaningful employment. During 2019, Wheeler AIC programs assisted 119 individuals in obtaining employment, exceeding the statewide benchmark.
