Community Health Center Opens at 855 Lakewood Road, Waterbury

Residents of Waterbury and surrounding communities now have access to an expanded array of primary care and behavioral health services with the opening of Wheeler's new <u>Waterbury Family</u>



<u>Health & Wellness Center at 855 Lakewood Road</u>. This community health center moved from 100 Jefferson Square and opened on May 11 at the new location.

An expanded array of primary care and behavioral health services, including medication-assisted treatment for addiction, is offered through walk-in, appointments, and telehealth and telemedicine services. On-site Genoa Healthcare Pharmacy and Quest Diagnostics services are coming soon. Thanks in part to a <u>grant</u> from the American Savings Foundation, NARCAN®, a medication that reverses overdoses, is available free to patients and families who do not otherwise have access to it.
